Most courses do have old files but some do not, as departments may restrict their access.  To gain access to exam files, you must share an old graded quiz, exam, or essay from a class that they took at UCLA. Students in their first quarter at UCLA will be granted access for their first registered quarter without needing to submit a graded quiz, exam, or essay.
